

Our Focus

The Kentucky Nutrition Education Program, as part of the University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service, encompasses two separate USDA programs:

The Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP) and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education (SNAP-Ed). Both programs utilize agents and assistants to provide educational opportunities for limited-resource individuals and families to acquire knowledge, develop skills, and change behaviors for improved health and well-being.

Our Challenge

Poverty

According to US Census estimates for 2017, the median household income in Kentucky is \$48,332, almost 20% lower than the U.S. median household income of \$60,336. Kentucky also has higher percentages of poverty and food insecurity among its population compared to census estimate for the United States overall.

In 2017, an estimated **2,415** Woodford County residents lived in poverty, and an estimated 77**1** were children under 18.¹

Obesity

Today, about half of all Americans have one or more chronic diseases, often related to poor diet and physical inactivity.² These include high blood pressure, cardiovascular disease, type 2 diabetes and stroke.



In 2017, the percentage of obese adults in Kentucky was 34.3%, ranking it in the top 10 states for highest obesity rates in the country. The percentage of physically inactive Kentuckians was 34.4%, ranking it as the most physically inactive state in the nation. Kentucky was also ranked in the top 10 for high percentages of adults with diabetes (12.9%) and adults with hypertension (39.4%).³ A large body of evidence shows that healthy eating habits and regular physical activity can help people achieve and maintain good health and reduce the risk of chronic disease throughout life.²

In 2015, **32.4**% of Woodford County's adult population were considered obese, and **23.9**% were considered physically inactive.⁴

Our Solution

Provide hands-on, nutrition education to limited-resource audiences, focusing on:

- Buying and preparing healthy foods
- Developing new meal planning and cooking skills
- Adopting new healthy lifestyle behaviors
- Managing SNAP resources

In 2019, **2,703** contacts were made with Woodford County residents who participated in nutrition education programming.

Our Results

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Lifestyle improvements

In 2019, 97% of adult participants made a positive change in food group choices and 83% showed improvement in one or more food safety practices. In addition, 92% showed improvement in one or more food resource management practices and 90% made changes to be more physically active. Youth participants also experienced behavior changes, with 87% improving their ability to choose healthy foods.

Our Success

First Year Community Garden a Success

community garden is a place to grow food, flowers, and herbs in the company of friends and neighbors. It's also a place to access fresh, healthy food to reduce monthly food or reconnect with nature and get physical exercise. This year the Woodford County Extension agent for horticulture partnered with Bluegrass Community Action to install the first community gardens in Versailles. The garden plots were placed at two locations for easier access by community members. The gardens were utilized by low income residents, the senior citizen's center, Extension master gardeners (for teaching purposes), and many other local citizens. The Extension agent and master gardeners provided ongoing support throughout the season and handson educational opportunities on site. These gardens will be expanded in the future due to their success this first year.
